Injustice

What does injustice mean?

Paper Chain People/ Hearts

1. Using the template page choosing either the people or the hearts. Cut along the solid line. Fold paper, accordion-fashion along the dotted lines.
2. The number of folds in the paper determines the number of people in the chain.
3. On the top piece of the folded paper, draw a person whose hands extend to touch the folds of the paper on each side or follow the template people.
4. Carefully cut around the person, making sure not to cut where the hands meet the folds.
5. Open up the paper and your child will have a chain of several people holding hands.
6. Colour them in with crayons, make different expressions on each face, or create a themed group.
